QUESTION TWO

Round One of an evening session is nearly finished when a late pair arrive. They are visitors who thought the session started later. Naturally you want to make them feel welcome. What changes would you make had you started with each of the following movements?

The total number of boards played must be between 27 and 33.

a) 10 tables set up as a Share & Relay Mitchell; 3 boards per round.

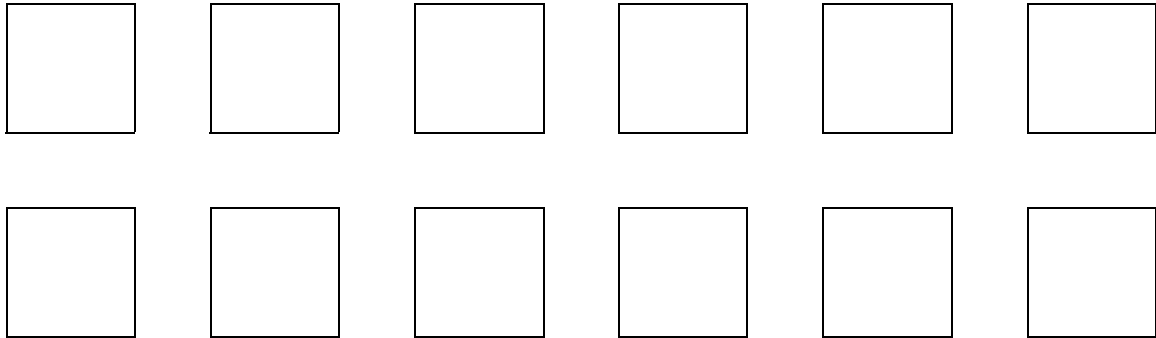
b) 4 table Howell; 4 boards per round

d) 12½ tables set up as a 1½ Appendix Mitchell; 3 boards per round.

What difficulties arise from a manual scoring point of view when a Skip Mitchell is used for 11 ½ tables ?

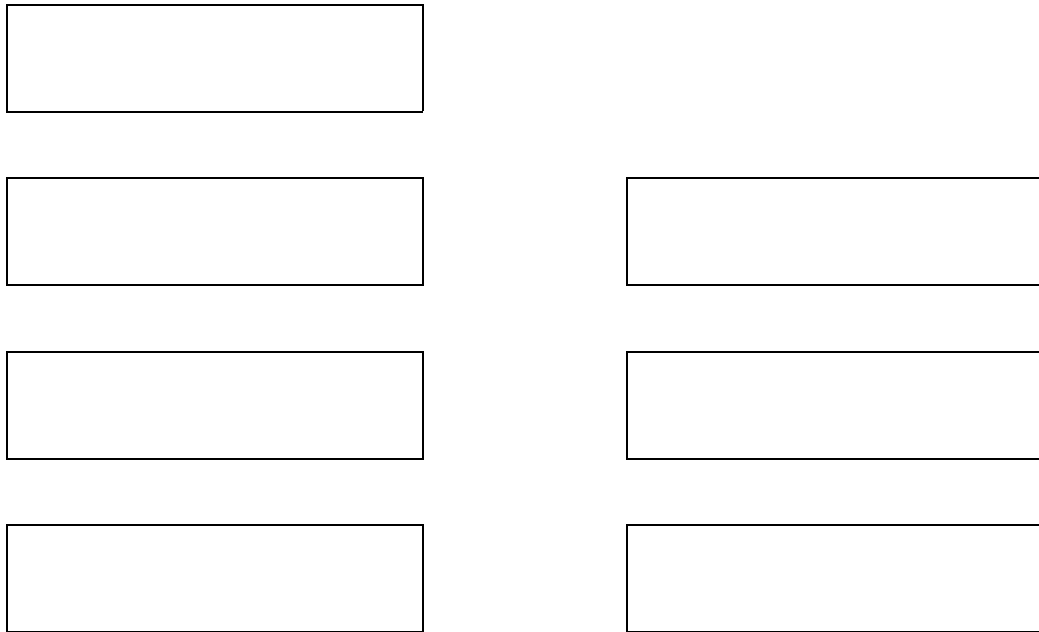
QUESTION SIX
