South's 2C bid was 'checkback Stayman' asking about partner's major suit holdings. North showed four hearts and then three spades to reach the good spade game. West started proceedings by leading the king of spades. If trumps were breaking 4-1 the contract would need a miracle in hearts and diamonds so our declarer assumed that they were 3-2 and set about trying to ruff a club loser in dummy. He ducked the spade king and won the spade ace over the queen. Then he crossed to dummy with a heart and led the club 3-2-J-K. When West now drew dummy's remaining trump, there was no way to avoid losing two spades and two clubs. Declarer had failed to see the possibility of a 'dummy reversal'. After winning the ace of spades, he held three more trumps in his hand which meant that he could trump all of dummy's losers (one heart and two diamonds) and had the entries to do this. West would be powerless, able to trump in with his top spade whenever he liked.
