



Lastly, please again support our Celebrity Speakers program with all proceeds going to the Friends of the Youth Bridge fund!




#### RECAP OF THE LAST GCC'S FINAL (2020 GCC OPEN TEAMS FINAL – SET 4 OF 4)

Team WARE (Michael Ware - Nick Jacob - Geo Tislevoll - Terje Lie - Max Henbest - David Wiltshire) had led throughout the entire final against Team CORNELL (Ashley Bach - Matthew Brown - Michael Whibley - Alex Antonios - Nabil Edgtton). After 45 out of 48 boards, WARE was in the lead by 30 IMPs. With three boards to go, it seems quite improbable to recover. But as they say, it ain't over until the fat lady sings...



Bach had room to bid 4♣ (non-serious?) and Edgtton correctly appraised his wasted ♥Q and sterile shape as not worth a slam try. Well done. Even 4♠ isn't 100% cold on a heart lead, but with the ♠A onside and clubs breaking Bach wrapped up his 11 tricks. In the other room, even after the ♠A lead and heart shift Jacob had no legitimate play for his slam but a miracle in clubs, which was not forthcoming today. Those 13 IMPs made the margin 17 IMPs.



Both Easts showed a mixed raise with 6-9 HCP and four trumps. Edgtton tried to steal the board in 4• and may have been surprised and delighted there was no more bidding.


4♠ proved no problem in the play, and neither did 4♥. The BBO auction was scrambled in the Closed Room but I wonder if Jacob might have considered a breach of discipline by saving, with unexpectedly short hearts? That was 15 IMPs more to Cornell, trailing now by just 2 IMPs as another flat deal hit the table...

I'm not sure why Brown tempted fate by bidding 5♥ not 5♠ but Whibley could be sure that if the grand slam was making his partner would have bid it holding four key cards.

In the other room everything up to 4♣ is clear. Thereafter, a few cuebids were exchanged and 4NT was RKCB. Henbest asked for the ♣Q and because the call was higher than 5♣, North thought he was being invited to 7. Henbest had explained that he was trying for 6NT had the partnership been missing the ♣Q (since he only knew about a 4-4 fit), though without clear agreements, North had assumed he was invited for the grand.

West doubled 7♣ and hoped it was Lightner - not just 'I have an ace'. Bach certainly read it that way, and Cornell had the title by 12 IMPs thanks to that 14 IMP swing. His team were unanimous that he was due the lion's share of credit for not attending; and congratulations to Alex Antonios, collecting his first masterpoints for winning a national title. I'd be surprised if that has ever been done before.

#### **COVID - CHECK IN APP**

As part of GCCEC Safeplan, upon entry into the GCCEC building, every guest attending the Gold Coast Congress will need to be double vaccinated, and check in using the Queensland (QLD) Government **Check In QLD App**. You can download this app on Apple Store by clicking <a href="here">here</a>, or the Google Play Store by clicking <a href="here">here</a>. Don't forget to link your Medicare vaccination certificate for easier viewing. Any guest that does not have a mobile phone - the GCCEC will offer Check-in facilities for the guest to enter their details. To relieve the pressure on the Administration Desk at this time and to cut down on the queues, we are leaving the web site on-line entries open right up until 2:30pm Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> February closing time for players wishing to enter and pay on MyABF.

You will still be able to pay at the Administration Desk using cash, cheque or credit card. Changes to existing entries (different players, changing events, cancellations etc.) will need to be made at the Administration Desk. Any changes to entries to these events will be charged an administration fee of \$10 per player.

#### YOUTH, STUDENT AND OTHER CONCESSIONAL ENTRY FEES-ADVISE WHEN ENTERING

- In accordance with Australian Bridge Federation policy, all players born on or after 1<sup>st</sup> January 1997 (under 25) are entitled to a 50% discount on entry fees.
- Courtesy of the Gold Coast Congress, all players born on or after 1st January 2004 (Under 18 years), or before 1st January 1922 (over 100 years) are entitled to free entry except for Walk-Ins.

#### **PARKING**

Parking will be available for \$12 per entry per day or \$60 for a weekly pass with unlimited entry from Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> February to Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> February inclusive.

The Bridge Administration Desk is the ONLY place you can obtain a weekly pass. It will be open on Friday 18th February from 3pm until 6pm then from Saturday one hour before play to half an hour after play finishes. Weekly passes can only be used from Saturday to Saturday inclusive.

For those requiring casual day parking, a one entry one exit ticket will be available from the machine upon entry. Those parking will need to pay \$12 on departure at the pay stations which are located at the lifts as you are exiting. Note that the \$12 ticket is a one entry and one exit ticket so if you intend to leave between sessions you will be required to pay a second \$12 parking fee.

#### **BRIDGEMATES**

If you have never used the Bridgemate Scoring Units we suggest you arrive a few minutes before your first session and ask a Director for a quick tutorial. We are confident that your opponents will also help you to use this user friendly technology.

#### PLAYER NUMBERS FOR THE TEAMS USING BRIDGEMATE II

During the team events, when you turn on the Bridgemates, you will be asked to enter your player numbers. This is NOT your ABF number. Each player in every team has been assigned a number. These will be found on the bright orange sheet which will be on your table at the start of play. NS at the home table should enter the player numbers for the players in your own team.

The reason for this is that, if done correctly, the scoring team will produce a summary of the results for each pair in your team, comparing their results against the average score across your section on each board (the datum). These results have no official status and are just for your own interest. It is a service we are happy to be able to provide, but in order to take advantage of it, it is important that the player numbers are accurately entered each round.

Our observations from recent years show that over 90% of teams sit in the same seats for the whole event. To simplify the process for entering player numbers for these teams, from Round 2 onwards if your team is sitting in the same seats as in Round 1, you may just enter "1" for all four players. The unit will display "same as Round 1" as the player names and the system will correctly record the pairs.

#### **RESULTS AND DRAWS VIA MOBILE**

If you wish to receive your results or draw via your mobile, follow these instructions: (1) Log in to your MyABF account, (2) go to your settings by clicking the icon on the top right hand corner of the page (either a person or three horizontal bars), (3) Tick the box under Personal Notification. (Note 1: If you have previously chosen to receive SMS notifications, this setting should be applied already; Note 2: You must have your current mobile phone number entered in your MyABF profile - Australian mobile numbers only.)

#### IF YOU ARE "CONNECTED"

The draw for the next round in the Teams and Swiss Pairs events will be published on the web at exactly the same time it is displayed on the projector screens at the venue. So if you are "connected" you can check your standings and the draw online.

#### **LUNCHES**

The Convention Centre Kiosk, The Combi, will sell a few sandwiches, salads and sausage rolls. We recommend you pre-order lunch to avoid long queues or BYO.

#### **COFFEE AND TEA**

As a service to participants the event will be operating by volunteers a tea and coffee service. Coffee is made from ground coffee beans with fresh milk and will cost \$4 a cup. The service will start around one hour before play and continue until late into the last session. Please understand that the service is run by volunteers. There will be \$20 vouchers and \$40 vouchers available for purchase from the Bridge Office. \$20 entitles you to 5 coffees without handling any money apart from payment (but cash will still be accepted). \$40 entitles you to 11 coffees. As we are not allowed to run the free water service in the playing area this year we will be selling bottles of water at \$2.00 from the coffee shop. These can be purchased via voucher in lots of 2's. We cannot under any circumstance give free – a cup of hot water so please don't request – it is a public liability issue. We will not be doing double shots this year. VOUCHERS CAN BE PURCHASED FROM THE BRIDGE OFFICE VIA EFTPOS OR CASH.

#### **CORRECTING SCORES**

#### Scoring Area Phone Number is 0456 587 765 – accepts text messages only

After each session, a printout of the results for each pair or team will be made available. For the last session of a stage of an event, you may obtain a copy on request from the Scoring Enquiries Desk located next to the Scoring Room.

If you believe that there is a mistake, you need to follow this procedure:

- 1. On the board where you believe that there was an error, agree with your opponents that the score was entered incorrectly;
- 2. Make the correction on your printout and have them sign it;
- Give the corrected printout to the Scoring Liaison Officer, Toni Bardon, under the sign "SCORING ENQUIRIES" next to the Scoring Room. She will check that you have provided all the necessary information. The correction will be made by the scorers during the following session and a new personal printout will be made available for you to collect.

Agreed scoring errors need to be advised within the scoring correction period for the session in which the error occurred. The scoring correction periods are displayed prominently near the scoreboards. At the conclusion of the scoring correction period, scores become final and, under the Laws of Bridge, no further changes can be made. This is critical for the last rounds when the correction period is limited and scorers may not pick up anomalies. You are responsible for your own actions - or lack thereof.

The Scoring team may be advised of potential scoring errors via text to: 0456-587-765 (receives texts **only**). Include the following information: Event, Session/Match, Pair number, Board number, Contract, Declarer, Score, What you believe is correct. The scoring team has a protocol to follow to determine if a result is manifestly wrong.

If it is not accepted or if the error relates to the number of tricks taken, you will need to obtain written confirmation from your opponents as described above.

World Championships have been awarded based on scoring errors. E/W Pairs should not simply acknowledge the scores on the Bridgemate, but should check them carefully. Incorrect scores can change the result of an event even though the relevant pairs may have nothing to do with the scoring error. They may also affect: draws for Teams and Swiss Pairs events, Masterpoints, Playoff Qualifying Points.

#### **SYSTEMS - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW**

System regulations are published on the GCC MyABF website.

Each pair is required to have two current ABF approved, systemically identical system cards on the table for the opposing pair before the start of each round. Overseas players will be permitted to use New Zealand and WBF system cards in addition to ABF cards. ABF system cards and guide to completing them are available at this site: http://www.abf.com.au/member-services/system-cards/

Subject to protection, **GREEN**, **BLUE** and **RED** systems as well as **BROWN** Sticker conventions may be in all events except for Restricted and Novice Pairs and Teams Championships, all 0-50 Masterpoint events, Rookie Pairs, Friday Novice Pairs and Restricted Butler Swiss Pairs. In addition, in these events, the CTD may also further restrict a pair from playing any method which the director judges may not be readily understood by a significant proportion of players in the field. YELLOW systems will only be permitted in the Open Teams from Round 3 onwards and not against teams with a current position in the lower two thirds of the field (decimals rounded up).

Teams proposing to use YELLOW systems should have already lodged an adequate copy of their system (including a bona fide suggested defence) with the CTD before 10:00am on 11th February 2022. Such systems are available for inspection as well as posted on the GCC website using the information tab.

#### **BROWN STICKER**

Some overcalls and 2-level openings attract a **BROWN sticker**. Weak 2-level openings without an anchor suit (RCO and Myxo Twos, etc.) are **BROWN sticker**. Pairs should attach **BROWN** spots to their cards. Also, multi one-level overcalls are **BROWN**, though gadgets used over 1NT or a strong 1\$\mathbb{a}\$ are not. Please also note that a Multi 2\$\mathbb{(}\text{ (or 2}\mathbb{(}\mathbb{)}\text{ showing a Weak Two in either major is an exemption from the **BROWN Sticker** category.

#### PROTECTED PAIRS

Pairs playing a **GREEN** system can apply for an Orange sticker if both are below Life Master or one is below State Master. This affords protection from **BROWN Sticker** conventions in all events where they are permitted with the exception of the major Final of the Open Pairs.

#### **ALERTS - SUMMARY**

#### **PRE-ALERTS**

List your unusual or complex treatments in the pre-alerts section of the system card. For instance – RCO 2's, Bergen raises, DONT Dbl vs 1NT, unusual carding (leading low from doubletons, etc).

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Announce the number of clubs contained in a 1♣ opening and the HCP range of a 1NT opening. Those playing a strong club system just need to announce 1♣ as "Strong 16+".

#### **ALERTS DURING THE AUCTION**

Alert by circling partner's call and saying "Alert" but don't offer an explanation unless asked (then aim to be concise, yet complete).

#### **DON'T ALERT:**

- Any double or redouble
- Any call beyond 3NT, except a conventional opening bid
- A bid of a suit bid or shown by an opponent
- Any 2♣ response to a 1NT opening bid in an uncontested auction (*e.g. Stayman*)

For our New Zealand and international players: We do NOT use STOP Cards

#### DO ALERT:

All other conventional calls (such as *Transfers*, 2♥=hearts and *a minor etc.*)

'Unusual' natural bids. These include: weak jump shift responses, pre-emptive jump raises, inverted minors, canapé tendency, negative free bids, transfer accepts that deny four trumps, etc.

At the end of the auction, the declaring side should mark any unusual calls that weren't alerted at the time. Do this with a plus sign (+).

#### IF PARTNER STUFFS UP

**Declarer/Dummy**: If partner fails to alert or provides a wrong or misleading explanation, you should wait until the *end of the auction* before calling the Director and correcting.

**Defenders**: wait until the *end of the hand* before piping up.

#### **DEFENCE IN DETAIL 1**

Liam Milne



Back again in 2022, Defence in Detail looks at real-life hands from the last six months with a focus on practical plays, counting the hand and logical thinking. These deals are designed to be solvable, so put on your thinking hat and play along as we defend the hand together.

Our first hand shows the importance of thinking about the whole hand rather than just the trick in front of you. Sitting West and playing matchpoints, you pick up the following:

♦ K96532 ♥ 62 ♦ A83 ♣ J8

The opponents have the following auction:

You see no reason not to lead your fourth highest spade, and the following dummy appears:

Vul: Nil	♠ J 10 8 ♥ K Q 8 7 ♦ K 10 7 5 2

West South North East 1NT15-17 Pass 2. **Pass** 2 Pass 3 Pass 3NT Pass Pass Pass

The first trick goes ♠5, J, Q, A. What are you thinking about at this point?

You should be thinking about dummy's long suit, diamonds. Your major problem will be when to play the diamond ace, seeing as it is your main card outside spades and is in the suit that declarer is likely to play soon to establish some tricks.

At trick two, declarer plays the ♥10 over to dummy's ♥K in order to lead a low diamond to partner's ♦9 and their ♦Q. Do you duck or do you win? What is declarer's likely diamond holding?

#### Solution:


In general, we like to play our aces on the opponents' kings or queens, but there might be more to think about here. Given how many spades we can see, if we take our ace and set up the spades, partner won't have any more to play to us later.

It also looks like partner has the ◆J – otherwise, why would declarer bother to cross to dummy in hearts when they could have led diamonds from their hand?

The defence's best chance is surely to hope to establish the spades while we still have an entry. It's not clear what will happen next, but you must duck your •A *smoothly* and duck again if declarer plays another diamond.

As long as partner gets in before you do and has a spade to play, the defence will be in good shape.

The full deal:



If you are able to duck smoothly twice, declarer is very likely to finesse the ◆10 on the second round, on the assumption that you might have taken the ace if you had it. In with the ◆J, partner can return their spade and establish the suit while you still have the ◆A.

If you take the ◆A, that is the end of the defence no matter how declarer plays the diamond suit.

**Point to remember**: It is often easy to foresee the major decisions you will have early in the defence. Advance planning at trick one can help you make the best play without giving anything away.

#### WELCOME TO NEW PLAYERS AT THE GCC

A very warm welcome to the Gold Coast Congress. If this is your first time at the GCC, be prepared for a World Class run tournament. I've been competing in tournaments around the globe for 17 years. The Gold Coast Congress is by far my favourite one as the organisation, the preparation, the staff, the location, the bridge all combine to make this a very successful and most enjoyable tournament.

Whether you've come as a veteran player, or a rookie player, there is always section that will suit your needs. But always remember, bridge is just a game so try and be nice and polite not only to your partner, but your opponents as well.

#### Being a Better Partner

Some might say that Bridge is just a card game, but all bridge players know that it is more than that – it is also a psychological game. Board after board, mistakes after mistakes, bridge is a mentally challenging game that requires you to manage your emotions at (and away from) the bridge table.

Being a better partner can have a twofold effect – it keeps the partnership trust at bay, and it allows your partner to play at their best potential which must be good for you as well. We all know mistakes will happen, but it is how you react to it that defines you as a bridge player. Are you the type to immediately question your partner "why did you play a club?", or are you the passive aggressive type and say in a gentle voice "we missed out on an easy game, but good thing you forgot to bid 4• as the play was not optimal", or are you the smile sweetly type and say "bad luck" or not saying anything at all?

On paper, it seems wise to be in the latter camp as we think that's the 'normal' thing to do, but the urge to say something (negative) can be quite strong as it makes us feel good to be seen as the "better player". Not only will this make the whole experience very unpleasant, but this negativity will more than likely induce more mistakes for the boards yet to be played.

Throughout my bridge career, I have experienced both sides of that coin, and I like to believe I have become wiser! My last big international tournament was the 2019 US Nationals where I played with Liam Milne. Playing in the Reisinger (one of the toughest events in the world), although most of the time I kept to myself, I must admit there was a time where I questioned my partner implying he made a huge mistake. Immediately realising what I had just done, I apologised for bringing it up and encouraged the both of us to keep focused because other (world class) players were also making lots of mistakes. Prior to the final session, a simple gesture of bringing my partner a cup of coffee (he loves coffee), unbeknownst to me, made him feel very happy and as a result he played at his best, which also allowed me to play at my best. Our team came third, amongst a field of only top players that have World Championship medals under their belts.

Give compliments from time to time (too many would make it feel superficial), don't dwell on the bad boards, don't discuss hands during the session but after the session and in a productive way – they are just some simple things you can do to be a better partner. Oh, and bring your partner a cup of coffee!

Good luck at the tables during this tournament.



#### Solution:

The deal comes from Australia vs Japan in an Asia-Pacific Women's Teams. In the old days one would not consider a vulnerable 3-opening with just six playing tricks. These days experts follow the Rule of 3 (bid three more than the number of playing tricks) and both Wests opened 3.



With Japan N-S everyone passed. You can forgive North for not making a takeout double when holding an 8-loser hand, but many would double.

How about South? It was very timid for South not to bid 3. Witness the other table where the late Margaret Bourke was in the South seat:

West North East South Bourke

3 Pass Pass Pass Pass

The ♣K was led and South made 10 tricks, +420, despite losing to the ♠Q. At the other table Barbara Travis was two down in 3♣ for –200, but +6 Imps.

Helping children affected by domestic violence aet back to school

#### ZEPHYR EDUCATION INC UPDATE

My name is Carmel Martin, I'm Zephyr's treasurer and Kim Ellaway has asked me to provide you with an update on what Zephyr Education Inc is doing almost 9 years after it began life as Zephyr Foundation. (The change came with incorporation so we could be given tax deductible status.)

QCBC - my home club's management and members, were right there beside me from the very beginning.

The wider bridge community continues

to support Zephyr with club charity days and individual donations. The QBA has Zephyr as its charity again at the 2022 Gold Coast Congress. The value of this exposure is incalculable, as it is our hope that someone will want to replicate our model in the remaining 3 States and 2 territories. Our appreciation for your huge support is humbling, overwhelming and gratefully received.

Most of you are familiar with what Zephyr Education is about. For those who are unaware of Zephyr's work - we provide (mostly) children in Domestic Violence shelters, Family Service organisations and outreach services with some or all of their school needs. This is, as and when required – on approval only, which approval is frugally and carefully assessed. We don't pay into any private accounts and often pay directly to the school.

The range of what Zephyr pays for includes:

- The full book list specific to the child's year and school;
- Full uniform including shoes, socks, hats;
- Swimwear;
- Lunchbox and water bottle;
- · Resource fees.

And as our funding has become more reliable, we are now providing iPads and laptops - an expensive, yet indispensable learning tool. We respond to requests immediately and we generally provide what's required within 24 to 48 hours.

Our aim is solely to have that child, the saddest and most vulnerable victims of domestic violence, look like every other school child, so they do not feel out of place, nor appear less valuable than others, nor attract the eye of a potential bully and in the hope that they can resume their education **successfully**.

We currently support 111 shelters in Queensland, all 7 in Tasmania and 16 in WA. That is a total of 134 organisations under Zephyr's umbrella. In the 12 months to July 2021 Zephyr supported over 3000 children.

Volunteers packed and distributed: 155 computers, 1776 school bags, 1238 pairs of school shoes, 1365 primary school packs, 400 high school packs;

And paid for uniforms for 1420 children, and resource fees for 172 children.

This amounted to \$467956 worth of cost price stock, uniforms and resource fees. We receive no government funding and yet Zephyr has become an acknowledged game changer in the sector.

We don't meet the children we help or their mothers, so we can't ask them, but from the emails received from the managers of the organisations we support, it's plain that Zephyr's role is vital, and, often enough, life-changing.

One shelter manager wrote:

'As always, I am so grateful for the support you provide our families! You should have seen this little boy on his first day of school with his uniform and books ready to go. Instead of being stressed his mum was able to relax and enjoy watching her baby start school. Your support has a huge impact on the lives of women and children and we can't thank you enough!'

Another said this to us:

'Just a brief line Isabella to thank you so much for meeting our request this morning and so promptly too. We are left breathless by the abilities and generosity of Zephyr. Please thank your team.'

And another piece of feedback read:

'A Mother said her kids had never had new uniforms before and that they "won't know themselves in new uniforms." She then broke down and cried.'

The DV shelters and other organisations we help are not funded to supply the educational support we provide. One shelter manager wrote:

'I often wonder what alternative options our families would have if it was not for Zephyr Education as there is very limited support available. As a service that works with the most vulnerable families, we are extremely grateful to be in a position where we can advocate (not have to beg) on behalf of our clients.'

Our focus is, and always has been, on the children and their education. We assist the carers of all children who fall within our scope, including Mothers, Fathers, Grandparents, foster carers and guardians.

Zephyr continues to be supported by a growing number (40), of talented and dedicated volunteers. None of our members or other volunteers receives any remuneration or allowances for their work. We operate from rent free premises and last year our unavoidable expenses, such as insurance, amounted to 1.6% of donations.

We didn't start Zephyr for 'feel good' reasons – My sister Isabella saw the need and marshalled a small army to make it happen. As I keep telling people, I just want to play bridge –that's the truth, but as Isabella mistook my reluctant acquiescence for enthusiasm, I too, within a short period of time, became a convert. Our husbands, David and Terry spend much of their time serving Zephyr as well.

One of the many unexpected joys Zephyr has brought us is the wonder at the enormous generosity of people – such as you. Thank you.

In past years at the GCC, we have run raffles and had specific collection days. Because of Covid restrictions, we won't be doing this but if you would like to make a donation, Kim Ellaway in the main office has kindly volunteered to accept these.

- if it is obviously too cold for you and those around you please ask the caddy to report the table number and section to Kim Ellaway who will bring her trusted thermometer to see if it can be fixed or perhaps we can move the table.

Things you can do that will **NOT** improve your comfort level:

- · discuss the issue with a Director or the Scoring Staff
- · discuss it with the Recorder


