A straightforward auction here: a strong no trump then 2C, Stayman convention, asking for a 4-card major suit. West leads the queen of spades and declarer South sees that she is in danger of losing a trump and three club tricks if she has to play clubs herself. An ancient desperation play when faced with having to open up a suit holding of JXX opposite QXX is to start with the jack from dummy. If East is asleep and plays low, West will win the king but now a second lead from dummy will allow the queen to score.

No such trickery is necessary on this hand however provided the trumps break 3-2. Simply cash the ace-king of spades and the ace-king of hearts and then play on the diamond winners. If East trumps in with the queen of hearts there will be only two losing options available – open up the clubs for declarer or concede a ruff-and-discard by leading a third spade. If East chooses not to ruff in, declarer will finally play a third trump which leads to the same losing options.
