
Bridge with Richard Ward

With eight top tricks in view, the ninth must come from either diamonds or clubs and there are many possibilities. West leads the jack of spades and the questions to contemplate are, which suit offers the best chances of an extra trick and which suit should be attacked first? In diamonds, the 77% line is to duck a diamond all round, then play the ace. Finally, if the king has not appeared lead towards the queen in dummy. In clubs, lead a low club and put in dummy's nine. Next will come the ace of clubs in the hope of seeing an honour so that the 10-8 can force a trick. Failing that, a 3-3 club break will see you home. And the order of plays? Start with the clubs as suggested, keeping the diamond finesse in reserve to the end.
