When you have a choice of two finesses, try to assess whether taking one of them first allows you to avoid the other one entirely, as here.

At a club duplicate session with no intervening bidding, many Souths opened one spade and then jumped to three spades which encouraged North to check for key cards and then bid six spades. Of those in slam, all but one drew trumps and took the losing diamond finesse. whereupon East cashed the ace of hearts for one down. The lone successful declarer chose to attack hearts first after winning the club lead and drawing trumps. When the queen of hearts was favourably placed, it was a simple matter to establish an additional heart trick for a diamond discard.
