After South's strong 2NT opening, North transferred to hearts then bid spades showing at least 5-4 in those suits. North then chose the obvious contract, avoiding 3NT which has no play after a club attack. When West started with the king of spades, declarer thought that there were ten easy tricks: one spade, five hearts and four diamonds. So the ace of spades was won immediately followed by the ace and king of hearts then four diamonds throwing both clubs. A club was ruffed but, unable to reach hand for a second club ruff, the defence won three spades and a heart for down one. The winning line, given the 4-1 trump break, is to start hearts by playing the king then the queen. Because the ace of hearts remains as an entry to hand, it is possible to ruff two clubs in dummy – making one spade, five trumps and four diamonds. Not an easy 'dummy reversal' line to find.
