

Bridge with Richard Ward



After the spade fit was found and North disclosed just two key cards in response to the key card ask, the small slam in spades was reached. West led the jack of hearts. East took the trick with the ace and returned a heart to declarer's king. Declarer saw that, if the trumps were at worst 3-1, he could ruff his fourth club in dummy if required. So declarer cashed the ace of trumps at trick two. The 4-0 break complicated things, making the idea of relying solely on the club suit for the extra trick unattractive. It takes some skill to recognise a 'dummy reversal' when you see one but, in this case, dummy can be made high by simply ruffing the two diamond losers. Then there are four spades, one heart, two diamonds, two diamond ruffs and three clubs = 12.
