

## **Bridge with Richard Ward**

Coping with wild distributional hands can be either satisfying when you get the bidding right or really, really irritating otherwise. This hand from the New Orleans Spring Nationals was reported in the International Bridge Press Association Bulletin.



Two spades was described as an intermediate jump overcall. Most experts would bid six hearts over five spades, although this sounds counterintuitive holding three aces and good spades. But partner has no defence, and the heart ace is unlikely to cash.

They lead a spade and, when both follow in trumps, you see that five spades was not making which is a pity. Still, they have not taken their club tricks, so all may not be lost. Hoping for a mis-defence and a miracle in diamonds, you cross to dummy in hearts and lead towards your singleton ace. East plays the king (wouldn't you?) so "all" that remains is to cross to dummy again and lead a triumphant jack of diamonds, pinning West's ten and making all thirteen tricks. You are a genius! Never underestimate the power of leading towards the closed hand!
