Some declarer-play problems can be planned as soon as dummy is tabled. Others, such as this one, end up just playing themselves so are less difficult. It also illustrates why transfer bids after an opening 1NT are so successful.

With South the declarer in 4S thanks to North's transfer bid of 2H, the king of hearts is protected on the opening lead. West leads the jack of clubs and, when the trump loser is revealed, the contract appears to require the ace of hearts to be with East but there is no hurry to play for that. Play king, ace and ruff a diamond. Cross back to hand with a club and lead the last diamond, When the queen appears it is obvious to discard a heart leaving West on lead with only losing options. It would not help East to ruff his partner's diamond winner, of course, since that would then mean just one trump and two heart losers overall.
