This hand from the recent World Youth Championships illustrates the way our up-andcoming champions approach the game. They bid as if they are bullet-proof. UK journalist, Mark Horton, uncovered this bidding gem. Enjoy.

The favourable vulnerability brought out the creative flair of the North-South players in both rooms. The 3D opening on a terrible 6-card suit and just one queen proved effective in keeping East-West out of their slam. South in the other room could not resist a psychic 1H opening which North raised to 2H. All this on a combined six high card points. West was undeterred finding partner with two key cards plus the king of clubs. 7C would have been worth +2140 but South - does this bloke ever stop bidding? – created something out of nothing with an audacious psychic double. West became concerned that an opening spade lead would be ruffed and so retreated to 7NT which had no play. This hand alone saved the USA team from a 20-0 trouncing by Poland.
