

## **Bridge with Richard Ward**

It is possible to make a good living as a bridge professional, especially in the United States where average players will pay very well in their quest for more masterpoints. Most professionals know that their livelihood depends on how well they treat their paying partners but sometimes snippets of sarcasm emerge. An apocryphal tale is told of an expert despairing of partner's unwillingness to draw all of the opponents' trumps. The final advice was: 'just keep leading trumps until both opponents stop following suit. Then you will know for sure that they have run out."



West starts with the king of clubs and declarer, seeing the obvious danger in the diamond suit if East gains the lead, allows West to win the trick as East follows with the ten - a suit-preference signal for a heart switch, duly led and won by dummy's ace. Next comes a spade to the ace and another back to the king just to be sure! Yes, trumps are all drawn. Tick! The heart loser is discarded on the ace of clubs and then the jack of hearts is played -H6-D6-HQ. The contract is now assured.
