
Bridge with Richard Ward

Here is an avoidance play involving a loser-on-a-loser and careful management of the small trump cards.



At one table, East opened two hearts which promised a weak hand with 5+ hearts and 4+ in either clubs or diamonds. South bid four spades and EW were then allowed to stop in five hearts, making a fortuitous twelve tricks for +680. At the other table when East passed initially, South's opening four spade bid won the auction.

West led the king of hearts and shifted to the two of diamonds. As the cards lay, playing low from dummy would have been fatal: East would win the trick with the king of diamonds and shift to a club, giving the defenders four tricks before declarer gained the lead. Instead, declarer won the ace and threw the diamond queen on the jack of hearts. Later declarer was able to get to dummy three times, (yes – check it out), to establish a diamond winner for a club discard. If the diamonds had broken 5-1, declarer would have had to hope that the ace of clubs was onside. That was a double-game swing and 15 imps.
