A bidding problem for a change this morning. You are West holding: **S** A10 8 **H** K 9 4 **D** 10 8 3 **C** A Q 8 3 and the bidding goes:

WEST	NORTH	EAST	SOUTH
PASS ??	4S	4NT	3S PASS

4NT by partner shows 'two places to play'. You have two decisions – which suit and how high to bid. A slam seems obvious and the best way to select the suit is to bid 5NT asking partner to choose.

Barring a ruff, six clubs is cold as is six hearts, a fine result in the face of the pre-emption and holding so few high cards. And, just in case you're thinking that this wasn't too difficult, see what happened at the other table:
