So, if you play one hundred boards every day, this specific hand will come once in 17.4 million years. This fascinating statistic has nothing at all to do with the following hand:

Here we have international youth players engaging in 'bluff-and-counter-bluff' bidding because that's what youth players traditionally do. West had a tough choice over four spades because she did not have a bid that invited a slam and asked partner for a spade control. But, as a four-heart opening bid often includes short spades, West decided to jump to slam then North, trusting his opponent, "sacrificed" in six spades. But West was not giving up yet. Rather than settling for a reasonable score by doubling this, she pushed on to the grand slam and then redoubled! Everybody at the table was confident that West had a spade void and so, when South led a club, plus 2940 was a nice top plus bragging rights for West.
