3D showed a 6-card suit and 16+ high card points. 3H was a feature on the way to a possible 3NT contract. 4S showed just 3-card support so West whooshed into the diamond slam. Sometimes this kind of leap is a reasonable gamble and avoids any confusion about which suit is to be trumps. West led a club won by the ace and a low diamond from dummy went to East's ace. Next came the heart J-Q-K-A. Had trumps split 2-2 there would have been no problem, but, as it is, the spades need to be unblocked (yes?) before drawing the last trump. This will lead to defeat when West ruffs the third spade. But there is a solution. Simply cash two spades, cross to dummy's jack of diamonds and discard the blocking spade on the king of clubs.
