
Bridge with Richard Ward

This hand came up over a decade ago when the World Bridge Games were held in Lille, France. You are sitting West and choose to lead the ten of diamonds against a 1NT:3NT contract holding: S:A7 H:A43 D:10984 C:9872. Dummy appears with S:1032 H: 872 D:AJ62 C:AJ10. Declarer wins the ace of diamonds and leads a heart: 2-5-J-A. What now? Placing declarer with something like H: KJ106, it seemed likely that the defence could have some hope in the spade suit and so tried ace and another spade. This was the whole hand.



And so it was that the master of swindles, Zia Mahmood, came to ten tricks instead of the eight made at the other table after trying a spade at trick two with West, using similar reasoning, finding the switch to ace and another heart.
