Bridge with Richard Ward

High level competitive bidding can be hit-and-miss at times although it usually pays to bid as high as you dare as quickly as you can then allow your opponents to make the last guess. Other 'rules' which work most of the time include: the 5-level belongs to the opponents; and the pre-emptive opener should not bid again. Today's hand has some more advice from Australian expert David Beauchamp.

You hold as dealer South at favourable vulnerability (not vulnerable vs vulnerable)

Do you bid? Around 80% of players surveyed suggested that there was no alternative but to pass. David suggested that a double, showing a desire to compete, was a very serious alternative. A double by a pre-emptor, by arrangement of course, asks partner to either pass for penalties or to push on to five hearts. Suppose partner had:

not much thought would be given to doubling initially but North should now be delighted to defend in the knowledge that partner is likely to contribute a defensive trick. Had this hand been less defensive, bidding five hearts should be a successful sacrifice. Fortune favours the brave.
